CLASS ACTIVITIES

December was a busy month for everyone! We send a very special thank you to three Erdman parents who stepped up to fill in for Lenae Badger when she was unable to play the piano for the Wednesday afternoon sing along. Kevin Sullivan, Parker's dad brought his guitar, former parent Caroline Hine brought her cello and Amy Lemerande, Bridget's mom, brought her fine vocal ability to make for a Holiday Pops atmosphere! You are just what Erdman Family School is all about!

We have moved our **SEF** grant **Outdoor Building Area inside this winter** so that children can continue their explorations. The pictures on the entry hall bulletin board illustrate how we have been using the new materials and how involved your children have become **experimenting with balance**, **momentum**, **gravity and construction**. Many budding engineers at Erdman!

This month the cold weather will give us a chance to explore winter science and art. All classes will experiment with the properties of ice and snow at the sensory tables and watch the changes from solid to liquid and back again. They will be able to describe and compare properties of liquids and solids. We will use ice, snow and water to create designs and pictures. Threes and Fours will learn about birds and make several birdfeeders to help our feathered friends through the winter months. They will also explore different animal habitats, what animals need in the winter and how animals adapt to seasonal changes. MTTH Threes will work with colors along with science, art and language activities. Our young threes will explore shapes and incorporate them into creative activities, constructions and games.

The **4 Day** class will create vehicles and flying machines while they investigate transportation and begin number themes. **MWF** and MTTH 4s will also work with shapes and numbers. They will create number books, number lines, explore many number manipulatives and enjoy counting out snacks at snack time. They will be connecting quantities of items to numbers, learning to identify numbers and increasing their number sense. Lots of STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and math) activities this month!

WINTER WEATHER ALERT

We follow the Scituate Public Schools for school closings due to inclement weather. No school in Scituate means no school at Erdman. A one hour delay in Scituate means a one hour delay at Erdman. More than a one hour delay means no morning classes at Erdman and no Lunch Bunch, but afternoon classes will be held. It is your responsibility to access this information via the Scituate schools website @

<u>www.scituate.k12.ma.us</u>. If Erdman must cancel for another reason you will be notified via email.

We will go outside to play every day that the temperature, including wind chill, is 20 degrees or warmer. The office uses the Weather Channel app to determine the Scituate "feels like" temperature.

We want our children to be able to enjoy all the fun that outside winter play offers. We make snowmen, snow forts, tunnels, take hikes and go sledding. So...Please dress your child warmly as the playground is cold and windy. Layers are great. Hats, mittens (NOT GLOVES), snow pants and boots are necessary and should be in your child's school bag every day from now until spring! Extra dry socks are a necessity, too and slippers can be useful indoors instead of heavy boots. Spending a few minutes helping your child learn to manage winter clothing increases self-confidence and decreases frustration.
