CLASS ACTIVITIES

4 Day 4's will observe the world around them with excitement as spring emerges. Respecting nature at its finest, will give plenty of time to create and enjoy outdoors! They will go back in time to explore dinosaurs, their habitats and their extinction. Creating diorama and erupting volcanoes does not disappoint. Each child will paint, assemble and bring home beautiful egg trees to share this special time of year.

Spring has sprung in the MTTH 4's! We'll watch our seeds sprout and notice how they change into mature plants. We'll create a spring egg tree by "planting" a stick and painting eggs to hang on its branches (please send in your egg halves!). We will continue our discussion of what makes each one of us unique. Each child will trace and paint life-sized self-portraits. This is a time honored activity at Erdman and it is exciting to watch child working hard to make their portrait "just right".

"It's All About Me" in the **MWF 4's.** We'll be busy learning our initials, calculating our height, tracing and painting our ages. We will explore "family" and what it means to each of us by graphing our family size and creating a family portrait. We will create some egg-traordinary spring trees (please send in your eggshells for this special project).

MWF 3's will have a short but busy month as they count down to blast off in the spaceship they worked cooperatively to build. They will explore terms like orbit, planets and gravity through literature and manipulatives. Science activities will also include investigating wind and kites while watching for signs of spring. We'll enjoy painting eggshells to create a beautiful spring egg tree.

MTTH 3's will experiment with wind and water this month. We'll explore the properties of water and place different items in our water table to become "trash". Each child will chose from a variety of recycled materials to design and build their own trash collector. They will experiment with their design and decide which collector worked best and why. Our class will also create wind socks and airplanes during the windy days of April and discover how wind can move different objects. These are two examples of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) at work in our preschool activities.

WF 3's will explore the world of nursery rhymes and folk tales this month. We will act out "Humpty Dumpty" (with real eggs) and try to engineer a safer landing surface so that maybe Humpty could have a better outcome. We'll also act out "Little Miss Muffet" and learn about spiders and why Miss Muffet might not want to be so frightened of our little garden helper. Folk Tales like "The Three Little Pigs" and "The Three Billy Goats Gruff" will also be acted out and a classroom egg tee will be decorated for spring. It will be a busy month!
